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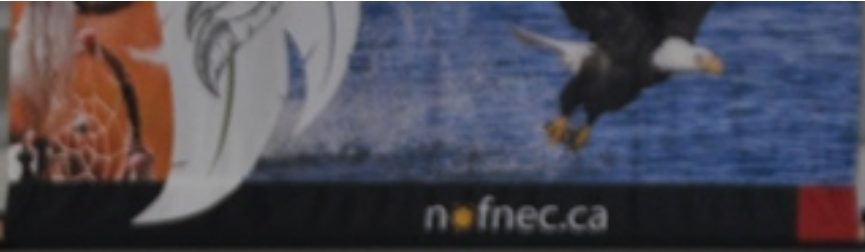




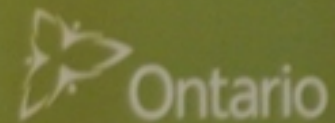








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Environmental Permitting & Plans Approvals Overview

- Mandated by regulatory trigger
- Intent: ensure compliance with regulations prior to the activity starting
 - Permits or approvals include conditions in which the activity will take place
 - May include timing of activities, monitoring, reporting, etc.
- The nature of the regulatory triggers (and type of regulatory approvals) depends on the nature of the project or proposed activities
 - May trigger federal or provincial regulatory approvals
 - May trigger other regulatory authorities
- Permitting and plan approvals can then vary by region and situation

POLYCHLORINATED BIPHENYL (PCBS)

Disposal

- Federal regulations mandate that PCB ballasts be replaced and disposed of by 2025.
- MOE provides an exemption from hazardous waste requirements to small waste generators for up to 40 9 in. fluorescent light ballasts.
- Best practice is to send PCB containing or potentially PCB containing ballasts for recycling/disposal.

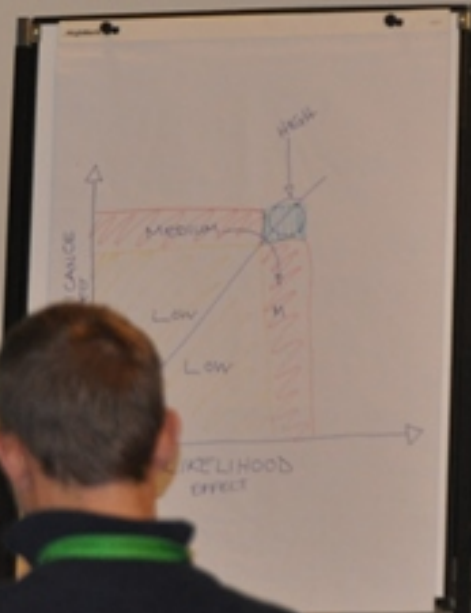
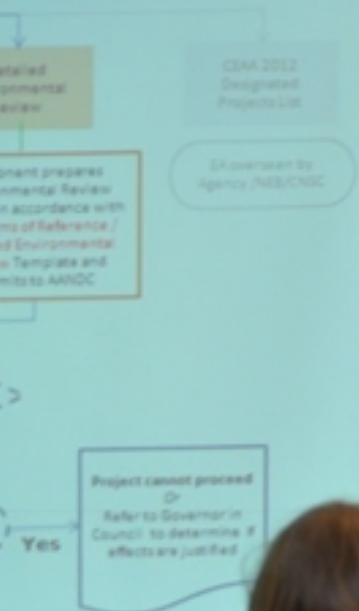

Geophysical Surveys



Why

- Measure Electromagnetic properties in bedrock
- Rocks and minerals in the bedrock conduct electromagnetic energy
- This information can tell a geologist what type of rock is underneath the ground

WHY

As geophysicists, geologists do this work?

HOW

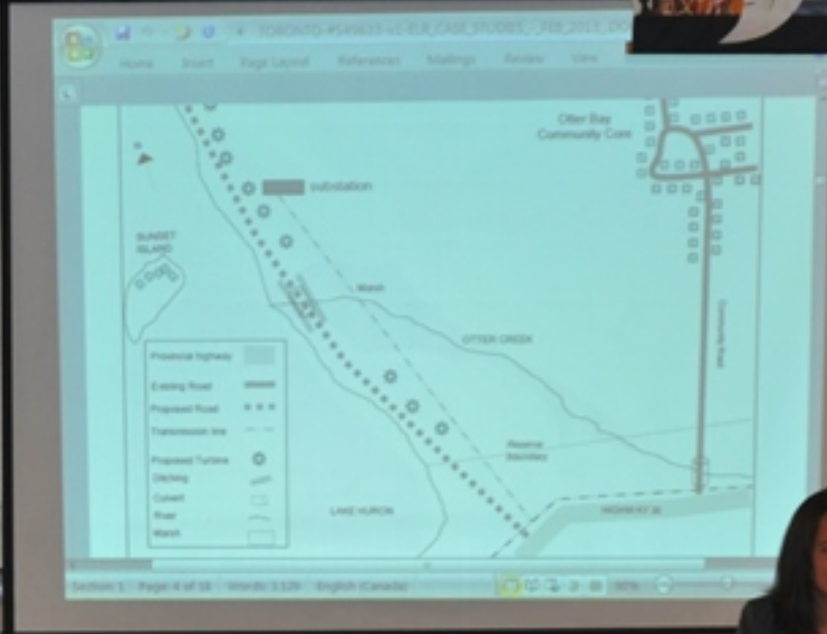
As the work done?

How

- Done by walking through the bush in straight lines
- Wire is stretched out along the ground
- The wire is hooked up to a generator
- A current passes through the wires and records the electromagnetic impulses from the ground
- This information is recorded into a computer
- It is like a metal detector that provides more detail

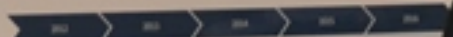


Next Steps
